As I creep up on my one year anniversary at United Way of Rockbridge (UWR), I cast my mind back to my first few days on the job. I was immediately struck by the variety and the vigor of all the organizations I came into contact with. I was so impressed with the work everyone was doing and I wondered if I would ever get my head around the scope of the nonprofit work being done here in Rockbridge County.

Now almost a year later, I continue to be overwhelmed by the levels of collaboration and support among agencies and I'm proud of the work UWR has done to support that. We have transitioned into facilitating the monthly meetings of the Nonprofit Leadership Council, as well as partnered with local business Devils Backbone to host a Jump on Board event designed to increase community volunteer participation with all local nonprofits. We continued our tradition of a successful children's book drive, collecting over 1,000 books this year to donate to local children. Thanks to a major donor, we were once again able to contribute books to the Rockbridge Christmas Baskets. We were also able to continue our efforts to provide school supplies and books to local children at A Day in K and SchoolFest. And of course we continued funding 20 local nonprofits who work to improve the health and wellbeing of Rockbridge County residents on a daily basis.
